The Moreno Gistain Piano Duo is formed by brothers Juan Fernando and José Enrique Moreno Gistain. They have performed as piano duo or soloist concerts in Spain, France, USA, Italy, UK, Russia, Slovak, Portugal, Austria appearing at the London ILAMS Festival, Lisbon Palaço Foz, Spanish Music Festival in Vienna, Perpignan Theater, Real Academia de España in Rome, Mozart Hall in Bratislava, among other major halls.

In Spain they have performed in many festivals and halls, invited by such institutions as **Granada International Music Festival, Castell de Peralada International Music Festival, Gijón International Music Festival, Barcelona International Music, Madrid Conde Duque Hall and Teatro Monumental, Juan March Foundation, Mozart Hall of the Auditorio of Zaragoza, Santa Cristina d'Aro International Chamber Music Season, Eutherpe Foundation.**

They have recorded for **Classical Radio** on **National Spanish Radio, Aragon Television, Catalonia Music, National Spanish Television, Canal Sur**, and on CD for the **Albert Moraleda** label.

In October of 2006 Juan Fernando was invited to play with the **Symphonic Orchestra of Spanish Radio/Television**, under the direction of **Adrian Leaper**, at the IV Victims of Terrorism Tribute Concert, which was broadcast on Spanish national TV's Channel 2, and presided over by the Princess of Asturias, Lady Letizia Ortiz.

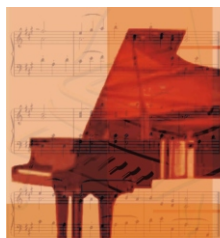
